For InDesign users, we have a file to add a Preset to the Export facility, to produce the best results.

To add our PDF preset to InDesign, on the Summit Print website from the 'UPLOAD' page click on the 'InDesign_Preset' link to download the file 'InDesign CS1-CS4 - PDF settings.zip' and save/download to your computer, then expand this zip file. Select the versions that you do not need and discard.

Here are instructions to install the Preset file for the export facility in indesign.

- To install

Open up InDesign (with no document open)

From the 'File' menu go to 'PDF Export Presets' - 'Define'

Click on the 'Load' button and load the 'Preset' file called 'CS1_PDF_Export_(Summit).pdfs'	for CS1 or
Click on the 'Load' button and load the 'Preset' file called 'CS2_HQ_Summit.joboptions'	for CS2 or
Click on the 'Load' button and load the 'Preset' file called 'CS3_PDF_(Summit).joboptions'	for CS3
Click on the 'Load' button and load the 'Preset' file called 'CS4_PDF_(Summit).joboptions'	for CS4

This will add a 'Preset' called 'PDF Export for - (Summit Print)'	for CS1
This will add a 'Preset' called 'CS2_HQ_Summit'	for CS2
This will add a 'Preset' called 'CS3_PDF_(Summit)'	for CS3
This will add a 'Preset' called 'Summit Print CS4'	for CS4

- To use

To create your PDF, just open the document then go to 'File' 'Export' and select 'Adobe PDF' at the bottom, then navigate to your output folder (can be any) and click 'Save'; now where it says 'Preset' click and select

'PDF Export for - (Summit Print)'	for CS1 or
'CS2_HQ_Summit'	for CS2 or
'CS3_PDF_(Summit)'	for CS3 or
'Summit Print CS4'	for CS4

and click on Export.

WARNING: YOU MUST CHECK THE PDF FILE CAREFULLY IN ADOBE ACROBAT, AFTER MAKING, ESPECIALLY FOR FONT STYLES & RENDERING! (they should be smooth edged when zoomed in)

Note: PDFs should run from Front Cover to Back Cover in the order they will appear printed and be produced as Single Pages (spreads off) with **3mm bleed** and **no surrounding marks** (crops, targets, info, colour bars etc.)
